

Child Protection and Creating Safe Environments January is Human Trafficking

Prevention Month: Who are the perpetrators?

Traffickers can be anyone who profits from the selling of a child for sex to a buyer, including family members, foster parents, friends, gangs, trusted adults, or "boyfriends." Much of the trafficking of children has moved from street corners and truck stops to the internet where children are sold for sex. Online classified sites allow traffickers and buyers anonymity and accessibility when exploiting children. In some case, there is no identified trafficker, and it is the person buying sex from the child who is exploiting the child's vulnerabilities. A child cannot consent to being bought and sold for sex, and anyone purchasing sex from a child is committing a serious crime. ## **NEXT SUNDAY JAN. 12, 2025** ~ BAPTISM OF THE LORD ~

The Feast of the Baptism of the Lord celebrates the revelation of Jesus Christ as God's beloved Son and the effects of the Holy Spirit. The readings will highlight Jesus' mission as the chosen servant and emphasize the significance of baptism.

# ~ IUBILEE 2025 ~

Jubilee 2025 opened Christmas Eve, Dec. 24, 2024 with the rite of the opening of the Holy Door at St. Peter's Basilica in the Vatican immediately before Pope Francis celebrated midnight

Mass. Pope Francis has designated Saint Peter's Cathedral Church in Erie as a place of pilgrimage. Bishop Persico has designated St. Leo Magnus in Ridgway as an additional place of pilgrimage. Holy Doors will also be opened at Rome's three major basilicas: St. John Lateran, St. Mary Major and St. Paul's Outside the Walls. The doors represent the passage to salvation Jesus opened to humanity. The Jubilee Year concludes with the closing of the Holy Door at St. Peter's Basilica on Jan. 6, 2026, on the Feast of the Epiphany. The theme of the Holy Year is "Pilgrims of Hope." the papal bull, issued May 9, 2024, that introduced the coming Jubilee Year is titled "Spes Non Confundit," or "Hope does not disappoint," drawn from Romans 5:5. "Everyone knows what it is to hope," Pope Francis wrote. "In the heart of each person, hope dwells as the desire and expectation of good things to come, despite our not knowing what the future may bring."



## THE CHOSEN: SEASON 4

The Chosen Saturday evenings begins Jan. 11th after 4:00 PM Mass, in O'Connell Hall. The Chosen, Season 4 is a groundbreaking, historical

drama based on the life of Jesus, seen through the eyes of those who knew him. Set against the backdrop of Roman oppression in first-century Israel, the seven-season series shares an authentic and intimate look at Jesus' revolutionary life and teachings. What started as a crowd-funded project has grown to over 250 million viewers and more than 17 million social media followers. "There's a lot of pain this season, there's a lot of grief this season." Elizabeth Tabish, who portrays Mary Magdalene, to Crosswalk. "But there's also hope and light. It's got some of my absolute favorite stories in the gospel."
